Microsoft Snip & Sketch**

Add our Edge to your practice!



<p>Snip & Sketch is a Microsoft Windows app (application). The Snipping Tool or the updated version “Snip & Sketch” allows you to capture a screenshot of anything that is available on your desktop!</p>	
<p>First go to your “Start” menu in the bottom left-hand corner of your computer. Scroll down the available programs until you arrive at “Snip & Sketch”</p>	
<p>Click on the Snip & Sketch icon/program link and it will appear on your computer desktop and in the lower toolbar (which some have on the side)</p>	
<p>Do a right mouse click on the Snip & Sketch button in your toolbar and click on “Pin to taskbar” making it readily available for future use. You can click on “Take a new snip” or to take a new snip in 3 or 10 seconds, allowing you to keep an item open in a picking list that would generally close once your moved from the list, and enabling you to make the “snip”</p>	
<p>Instead of using this task list, go to the Snip & Sketch window on your computer and click on “New”. If you had wanted to take a delayed snip click on the down arrow (“carrot”) to select the delayed snip</p>	
<p>Once you click on “New” you will be able to select the type of snip you prefer (rectangular, free-style, window, or full screen)</p>	<p>Are images on .gov sites free? ^</p> <p>US Government Image Collections.
